GLASS CAPACITORS

Capacitors may have an airspace between their plates, or have glass, plastic, wax paper, or oil between the plates. In the days of Benjamin Franklin capacitors were the previously mentioned Leyden Jars—so you are now learning 200-year-old physics. If a glass capacitor is charged, but the glass between
